COINS TELL ENGLAND'S STORY

SO FAR, there are not many women numismatists in this country—but they are catching up fast.

Mrs Monica Bussell, one of Britain's top experts on English copper coins, was pleasantly surprised to find when she visited Hull recently, that the local society had a woman secretary, Miss Jean Jackson, and a woman treasurer, Mrs F. D. Tuxworth.

I asked Mrs Bussell how she first became interested in the subject. "By accident," she replied. "A mother of four, she was for 20 years a Fleet-street publisher's assistant."

So Mrs Bussell became Padriguez's only woman porter—and a bit of a legend. "I was loved by all sorts of interesting people, especially refugees," she told me.

After the war, she found it difficult to make a come-back into journalism, so she joined a famous firm of coin dealers. She became fascinated by the coins, however, and today she is in charge of the English copper department at the British Museum.

Her hobby is a die-hard one. She has a collection of over 17 years in the business, she has been a member of the Society for the Study of English Coins since its inception in 1947.
