BRITAIN IS NOW READY to enter into negotiations with the Common Market countries on terms for her entry into the European Economic Community. Rightly, the Government is verging on the side of caution, for the problems are not easily to be brushed aside. Indeed, it must be conceded that the country as a whole is far from convinced that the economic advantages of entry into the EEC, proclaimed by the pro-Marketeers, will compensate for the sacrifices involved. For this reason it is a source of disappointment that meither the Government nor the other two main political parties (who are both committed to pursuing entry into Europe) have had the courage to put so momentous a question to the electorate.

Yet, this said, we must return to our original boint: that the long-term economic and political dvantages of British participation in the new buropean build-up would be unquestionable. Perhaps, after all, it must be a matter of faith.


