Mrs. Myrtle Aylor, of 6615 Rawlings, returned this week from Birmingham, Alabama, where she attended the unveiling of a monument as a memorial to her uncle, the late Rev. W. D. Hargrove, B. D.

The Rev. Hargrove was the pastor of the Union Bethel Independent Methodist Church which he founded in 1932. He broadcast a religious program over radio station WSGM for six years, probably being the first radio minister in the South. He also taught school in South Alabama.

A graduate of the Price Normal School, he studied for two years at Tuskegee Institute and later was graduated from the theological school of Payne university. Relatives living in Cleveland beside Mrs. Aylor include a sister, Mrs. Lula Pryor, and a niece, Mrs. Mammie Smith.
